Dear future Breastfeeding Peer Counselor,

Welcome! I'm so happy that you will be attending, *Rush Mothers' Milk Club Presents: Breastfeeding Peer Counselors training for the hospital setting.* Successful completion of this course and receipt of certificate is not tied to a paid position as a Rush Breastfeeding Peer Counselor, however, your training may be used as a springboard to obtain a position as a breastfeeding peer counselor within a hospital setting as it has for many of our past participants. This is a unique course and the information you receive will be helpful in your professional practice, personal or community contacts. Here are the details regarding our days together:

On October 26th, we will meet at the elevators just outside of the Rush NICU, 8th floor tower, at 10:00am We are a locked, closed unit. Please wait behind the blue glass in our waiting room. I will come and get you and we'll enter the NICU as a group.

Parking / Directions: If you are driving to Rush: There is scarce street parking or parking is available in our visitor parking garage: you can enter the garage on the Harrison side just west of Ashland. Take the set of parking garage elevators located along Harrison /north side of the garage to the 4th floor. Take the 4th floor walking bridge over Harrison to the atrium entrance at Au Bon Pain. The attendant at the main front desk will direct you to the tower visitor elevators. Take the elevator to the 8th floor and have a seat behind the blue glass. **Paying for parking:** Take a ticket when you enter. You will need to pay for your ticket at a kiosk before returning to your car October 26th.

If you prefer to be dropped off: come to the main entrance at 1620 W. Harrison. Take the atrium entrance elevators to the 4th floor and head east toward the white butterfly-shaped tower building. Take the tower visitor elevators to the 8th floor. Please wait behind the blue glass waiting room outside of the elevators. I will meet you and walk as a group to our class location.

Some other info you should know:

- On day one: we will provide coffee and a small breakfast. Feel free to bring snacks and beverages for yourself or to share daily.
- On the final day of training, there is no lunch break because we will have a graduation ceremony; families are invited to attend this celebration.
- For lunch breaks, there are 3 options to purchase lunch within our campus:
- 1. ABP (Au Bon Pain) on 4th floor atrium building
- 2. Cafeteria: lower level academic facility entrance
- 3. Subway: ground floor orthopedic building @ Harrison & Ashland

Feel free to bring your favorite snacks, beverages-whatever you like. Pumping mothers we will accommodate you of course [©] Healthy, symptom-free breastfeeding babies are welcome to attend with you. Please let me know if you plan to bring your nursing baby.

******Please note******you must attend all days in their entirety to receive your certificate of completion. If for some reason you must leave early, start late, or miss a day – you will have to make up that time missed at the next training and will not receive your BPC certificate until your missed content is complete – <u>so please plan to attend this entire course as scheduled.</u>
